



General information

In this pack, you can find all the necessary materials for the correct implementation and use of the scenario:

- ***Guidelines for scenario development***, which contain the scientific literature references utilized by the research group, with the respective framework and main article.
- ***The Scenario overview*** is a general synthesis document of the principal elements of scenario: the context of execution, students that can be involved, learning objectives, roles covered, etc. This document is useful to have an overview of educational potentialities of these scenario typos, in fact, is suitable for different situations that can be happened in reality, related to a specific argument.
- ***The Teacher template*** contains the operational and technical details on each scenario. We can find the specific learning objectives, time frame, details on roles, clinical case, etc. Every template is specific to a single situation.
- ***The Context description and script***, contains all the details about the scenario. In this document, we can find the details of some points where the educators can stop the video and suggest some questions to students to enhance reflexion.
- ***The slide*** includes a graphical synthesis of what is exposed in the “teacher template”, with an extra addition of literature insight on every theme covered the specific scenario, available through hyperlinks to the scientific papers.

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- **The video** shows (with verbal explanation), and the scenario related to a hazard event. During the video, on the bottom of the screen, some questions appear to enhance reflection: these questions need to be implemented with the ones contains into “context description and script” documents. At the end of the video, there are also the debriefing questions, with more reflection points.
- **The Debriefing sheet** contains the rationale under the questions proposed to conduct this important moment, in addition to the questions, divided to different phases of reflexion (the same questions are presented in the “teacher template”, and at the end of the video).
- **The Feedback sheet** is a form to collect comments and suggestions from the scenario users (students or educators). These forms will be managed by the research group.
